School Law Notes; ISD Board Briefs; and a letter from the Department of Veteran Affairs were distributed as informational items.

INFORMATIONAL REPORTS:

- 1) High School Drug Summit
 Student Council Advisors Chris
 Bondsteel and Alison Desmarais outlined
 the agenda for the first-ever Drug
 Forum Day March 8th at Leslie High
 School. The drug forum is to provide
 knowledge and prepare high school students
 for life after graduation. Ten speakers
 will be presenting different topics.
 Parents will be invited to attend the
 sessions. Student AnnJel Moore spoke
 about how student peer pressure can be
 dangerous, but ignorance can be deadly.
- 2) Quarterly Report on Focus School
 Leslie Middle School Principal Carol Franz
 gave a Power Point presentation highlighting
 the decrease of students with failing
 grades. Ms. Franz was pleased with how
 the AIMSWeb data triangles look. The possible
 retention of 7th and 8th graders was discussed.

3) Finance Report

Business Manager Anita Strong reported on the status of high school internal accounts. She said all accounts will be reconciled before the end of the fiscal year. After that, a process will be created to reconcile accounts once a year. A draft of the proposed second budget adjustment was distributed for board review. This will be an action item on the March 14th, 2016 board agenda.

- 4) Early Warning Signs Grant
 High School Math Teacher Emily Ambs
 teaches an intervention class (Math Skill
 Builders) that is taken along with Algebra I.
 She applied for a grant for computers and a
 computer program that would identify gaps in
 students' knowledge to help increase math
 skills. This data allows her to structure
 the class according to students' individual needs.
- 5) Michigan Transition Services Conference High School Resource Teacher George Manson submitted a proposal to present data at the MTSA Conference on March 17th, 2016. He will be talking about a program to help students with transitions.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- 1) Enrollment
- Supt. Jeff Manthei reported that enrollment is 1,399 as of Feb. 3, 2016. This number includes students in Ingham Virtual, GSRP and drive-ins.
- 2) Targeted Literacy Instruction and Interventions Grant
 Supt. Manthei said a grant for \$13,200 was received. Funding will be used for additional instructional time to help students in grades K-3 to learn to read at grade level and help with math skills

by the end of $3^{\rm rd}$ grade. Some of this grant money can be used for the summer school program.

3) Grants Awarded as of Feb. 1, 2016
A compilation of grants awarded as of Feb. 1st, 2016 was distributed to board members. The total is approximately \$43,000 for this year.
