On October 31, Leslie Public Schools was notified that we were awarded a safety grant of \$184,690.00. The grant is part of the Competitive School Safety Grant Program awarded by the State of Michigan and administered by the Michigan State Police.

The grant will be used to help purchase a door security system for all classrooms in the district. The door security system is known as the SmartBoot. This system will make it almost impossible for an intruder to access a classroom once the system is activated. The system also alerts 911 within seconds of being activated.

The safety of our students and staff has always been and will continue to be the top priority of the district. Thank you to all the staff who helped write and process the application for this grant. It is because of our hardworking staff members that Leslie School District continues to be a great place for students to learn and grow.

Phoebe's favorite media to work with is acrylic paints and watercolor. She enjoys painting portraits and landscapes.


Alicia's favorite medium to use is colored pencils, although she tried charcoal this trimester and enjoyed it.

Katelyn's favorite medium is water color, paints, or pencil. Her goal is to attend Kendall College of Art and Design after high school.














Leslie Middle School athletes had a very successful fall season. We sponsored a combined 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade football team, boys and girls cross country teams comprised of 6^{th} , 7^{th} , and 8^{th} graders, as well as separate 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade volleyball teams. Our student athletes had many wins and made many good memories, but more importantly, they continued to grow in their sports as well as academically.

The 7th grade volleyball team, coached by Tammie Doane, played a ten game regular season along with two tournaments, one at Vandercook Lake and the season ending GLAC tournament hosted by Leslie. The 7th grade volleyball team, comprised of 18 ladies, posted a 7-3 conference record during the regular season. The ladies, coming in with a foundation of basic skills, a willingness to learn, athletic talent, and a competitive attitude, learned new skills and how to play as a team and tied for

third place in the conference. Look for good things from these ladies in the future.

The 8th grade girls volleyball team ended up with a winning record overall for this season. The girls worked hard to improve their skills and by the end of the season, everyone could serve overhand! Some of the best times

were when the girls were working and laughing together as a team. They really enjoyed having the varsity team come and help them out with skills to prepare them for next year.

The LMS cross country team was young but talented this year. The 5th and 6th grade boys and girls team won a few meets.

In the boys GLAC league meet, Cam Pierce and Ethan Lubahn earned all-league honors. Overall, 8 of the 30 all-league runners were from Leslie. The future of Blackhawk Cross Country looks bright!

The LMS football team, coached by our superintendent Jeff Manthei, was comprised of 31 players. They ended the season with a record of 3-3-1. The team started the season with a 20-0 win over the combined Morrice/Webberville team. The Hawks also beat Perry 46-14 and Stockbridge 48-6. The team lost to an undefeated Fowlerville team with a score of 20-14 and Whitmore Lake with a score of 25-14. The Hawks tied an undefeated Williamston 22-22. Williamston had only given up 14 points all year before this game. The team worked very hard, and we are looking forward to the future.

year head coach Matt Haley, qualified for the MHSAA State Finals at Western Michigan University for the first time ever. After finishing an impressive third place at regionals in Portland, sophomores Kyle Medcoff (#4 singles) and Nathan Foltz (#1 doubles) became the very first Leslie male tennis players to go to the state meet. The team, who played a very

tough schedule, finished 5-8 in dual meets and also won the Ovid-Elsie Quad Meet. With all players returning next year, the future of this co-op team looks bright.

The men's and women's cross-country team, led by veteran coach Ron Beegle, had many big holes to fill after several athletes graduated last year. Both teams finished third in the GLAC this fall and won the annual Blackhawk Invitational back in September. Individually, sophomores Haley Ellis and Gavin Weber both qualified for the state meet at Michigan International Speedway on November 3. Garnering GLAC first team all-conference honors were sophomores Gavin Weber, Gabe Weber, Haley Ellis, and Lily Robinson. Earning second team honors were senior Grace Klemmer and sophomore Jack Casper. Making the honorable mention teams were seniors Brittney Medcoff and Luke Lasky and freshmen Tyler Hile. With most of the runners returning next year, the Hawks are set up to regain their perch at the top of the GLAC.

The boys soccer team, under the leadership of second year coach Mike Compton, had another good season, finishing second place in the GLAC. The boys took the league champion, Lansing Christian, to the brink twice. They lost to them in the final two minutes of the regular season match-up and then dropped an even tougher match in the league tournament final in overtime. The team finished 3-1-2 in the GLAC and 8-11-3 overall, playing a challenging non-league schedule. Earning all-conference awards for the Hawks were senior Justice Rosier and juniors Jarrett Brown and Jordan Beers, all of whom were chosen to the first team. Senior Marcus Losey and sophomore Garrett Mays were second team selections. Junior MacGyver Nichols was also an honorable mention choice. Brown, Rosier, and Mays were also selected to the all-district team.

Tom Johns directed his second season of Blackhawks varsity football. The team finished the season 3-6 overall and 1-4 in the GLAC. They won two victories against Dansville, who played deep into the state playoffs, and also defeated Eaton Rapids for the first time in five years. Earning first team honors this year were senior all-purpose back Anthony Smieska, senior Thomas Coltrain, and junior offensive linemen Wyatt Wiljanen. Junior James Tow at linebacker, junior Nick Reeser at defensive linemen, and sophomore kicker Garrett Mays were chosen to the second team. Sophomore Lucas Mooney was an honorable mention choice at defensive back. Our JV football Hawks had a fine season under coach Tucker Surbrook. They finished their season 5-4 overall and 3-2 in the GLAC which shows true promise for the future.

The varsity volleyball team, led by Danielle Gibbs, showed tremendous improvement this season. The girls finished in fifth place in the GLAC with a 2-4 record, and they were 14-22-6 overall. Their record, however, is not indicative of how well they played throughout the season, losing many matches only in extended sets. The high of the season was defeating both Olivet and Stockbridge for the first time in many seasons. Senior Ellen Coppernoll was a second team all-GLAC choice, and senior Toria Jones was selected to the honorable mention team. The JV team, coached by Missy Smieska, also showed a huge improvement this season. They finished 3-2 in the GLAC and 16-20-7 overall which put them in second place in the league behind Lakewood.
