Changes have been made to the morning drop-off in the Loop to assist with the overall congestion. We have a staff member stationed at Door 13 to greet students who are waiting in line. We will also have some additional changes coming soon from the city. There will soon be signs along Pennsyl-

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vania in front of the school property that restrict parking on the street during school hours. Turning left out of the Loop area will also not be permitted. All traffic will be expected to turn right during both AM and PM drop-off and pick-up times. As a reminder, we open the school doors at 7:25 AM for students to enter for the day. If we could have you leave a few minutes earlier than normal to bring students to school, that would be an added advantage for the morning drop off, too. **Please note:** There are several parking spaces along Pennsylvania in the Loop area for families to park and escort students to the main door.
